ITEM TITLE	After School Club & Sports Stipends
DISCUSSION NOTES	We will need to approve up to \$5,000 to pay for coach stipends and club supervisors. Possible Clubs; FCC, Choir, Robotics, Coding for Girls, Kindness Crew, Garden Club Sports; Basketball, track, Cross Country
	Discussion: Current stipends; \$1,000 for weekly meetings, \$500 biweekly. Supervisors and coaches must clock in and out in order to receive the money. It is not a one check stipend but weekly time added to paycheck. If



someone forgets to clock in and out, they should fill out a Time/Edit Form with Carmen.

The totals were based on 1 hour meetings. Biweekly= 2 hours a month x 10 months= 20 hours x \$25/hr.= \$500 Weekly= 4 hours a month x 10 months- 40 hours x \$25/hr.= \$1,000

Up to two supervisors per club and further discussion regarding coaches. We may need to revisit the amount of time as it doesn't include any planning for the clubs.
